

BUILT 2 BLESS 10



It looks like an ordinary key but it sold for \$117,000 at auction in 2017 and could have saved the Titanic from disaster. It is the key to the crow's nest (look out) locker that contained the binoculars vital in detecting icebergs and other ships during the pre-sonar and pre-radar days of 1912. The Titanic catastrophe, killing 1,522 lives, could have been avoided if 2nd Officer David Blair had not in haste forgotten to hand off this key to his replacement after his shift as lookout in the crow's nest.

Without access to the binoculars the Titanic was essentially ‘blind’ and could not see the fatal iceberg in their path until it was too late to take action.

(Adapted from Graham Tibbetts) Like the Titanic, many ‘icebergs’ of conflict could be avoided in our families, hundreds of ‘spiritual’ lives saved each year in our church families, and thousands of unchurched reached in our communities if God’s men would get serious about using His keys to healthy relationships and principles of reconciliation.
